Dear Parents/Carers,

This week it has felt like winter at times but our days have been brightened by the Year 6's wearing their 'leavers' hoodies to school. This always evokes mixed emotions for us.

You would have seen a letter sent today about our Ofsted report. We are so extremely proud of our staff for the commitment that they make to the school and the children but we couldn't have done this without the support of our wider community and the amazing children that we have here at AVA.

On Wednesday all of our teachers took part in external moderation with other schools where we looked at writing and the progress that our children are making.

In history lessons this week we learned about D-Day and talked about its 80th anniversary.

Next week our Year 1 children will participate in their Phonics Screening. Our Year 4 children all undertook their Multiplication Tables Checking exercises (on the computers) this week. It's always a busy time of year but we try to be as relaxed as possible in school and the children take everything in their stride.





On Monday. Year 2 had a '*roarsome*' day. They met Joel, who talked to the children about dinosaur fossils from lots of different types of dinosaurs. They became palaeontologists, and practiced digging and discovering different fossils, using information provided to identify which dinosaur they belonged to.

We then met 3 baby dinos, a baby paralophosaurus called Poppy, a baby triceratops called Patrick and even a cheeky baby T-Rex called Jake - we waved to him from a distance!

The rest of the day was full of dino-tastic activities, which all enjoyed!

#### **Price increases**

We have been desperately trying to keep the prices that we charge for wrap around, school meals and clubs as low as we possibly can but unfortunately with all costs increasing, we have no choice but to increase these come September.

All the systems will be updated over the summer, but we wanted to give advance notice of these increases to prepare our parents that are impacted most.

- Our hot meals will increase from £2.65 to £2.85 per meal.
- Our enrichment clubs (those run by staff) will increase from £1 per session to £1.50 per session
- Our wrap around care will increase as follows:

- Breakfast club £4.00 per child per session to £4.50 per child per session.
- Wrap around until 4.30 will increase from £5 per child per session to £5.50 per child per session.
- Wrap around until 6.00 will increase from £10 per child per session to £10.50 per child per session.
