PARENT BULLETIN 5 27th September 2024

Dear Parents/Carers,

This week has been challenging at times for all of us with extreme weather making life a little bit more difficult than normal. Thank you to those of you who have helped keep our children safe by parking sensibly and where possible still walking to school. We understand that in the rain it's easier to drive, however, this means that the roads around the school become congested and dangerous. Hopefully the weather might settle over next week and a little bit of normality will resume.

We are getting ready for open evening on Tuesday and open morning on Thursday next week. Please remember that we will be closing early on Tuesday and preschool children will remain at home all day. Timings are as follows: Preschool - closed all day.

Reception - collection at 1.00pm Year 1 & 2 - collection at 1.10pm Year 3, 4,5 & 6 - collection at 1.20pm

Please can you ensure that all your child's belongings and uniform are labelled. This needs to be clear with the name (not just the initials). Please also check the labels regularly as they do wash out. We understand how frustrating it can be for a child to come home with bits missing but with over 520 children on a large site it is hard to return unnamed items. If your child returns home with the wrong uniform or belongings, please return them to school as soon as possible. Thank you for your help.

All of our preschool staff and some of our other staff members have completed their annual first aid training this week. The two-day paediatric course that they undertake is intense but essential in providing the best support that we can to all the children here at AVA primary.

IROCK Sessions started in school this week and it was lovely to hear the children making music whilst coming together with their friends to form their rock bands. Here at the school we are passionate about the arts and are forever looking for new and different ways to get involved in local projects. Miss Large is currently running an activity within school which will be part of the Waddesdon Manor Christmas festival this year, we cannot wait to share more details with you.

You will have received a flyer yesterday about the October half term holiday camp being run from the primary school by YDP. This is a great opportunity for children to access fun holiday activities at a discounted price.

Harvest

We are fast approaching our harvest assemblies and therefore will be collecting produce for our local food bank in school. We understand that times are difficult for everyone but if you can help us to help others by bringing in items this would be much appreciated. Again, this year, we have pledged to support the local Roman Park Community Trust Foodbank.

Sadly, the most recent government data shows that the number of people in food insecure households in the UK rose by around 2.5 million to 7.2 million between 2022 and 2023. This means 11% of people are living in food insecure households, including 17% of children.

However, this is not just about data, what it actually means is that food poverty is directly affecting families within our school and local community at this very moment.

The Roman Park Community Foodbank offers help to local people in crisis, who are often referred by specialist agencies and this Harvest Time we welcome the opportunity to give what we can to those in need.

We would be grateful if your child could bring in any of the following, to help with our collection for this worthwhile cause.

- Tinned soup, meat, veg
- Sugar/flour
- Snacks like crisps, biscuits or crackers
- Cereal Packets
- Sauce Jars
- Stir in Sauces (eg: Chicken, tomato to add to pasta)
- Baby/Toddler food
- Jams and spreads
- Dried Rice/Pasta/Noodles
- Toiletries such as deodorant, shampoo, shower gel, etc.
- Toilet Rolls

Unfortunately, the foodbank is not able to store fresh or chilled items. Small packets and tins are preferred, if possible.
