As part of our World Book Day celebrations this year, we are overjoyed to announce that West End in Schools will be returning to AVA Primary on Tuesday 4th, Wednesday 5th and Thursday 6th March 2025!

They will be coming in to run drama workshops with a focus on the traditional tale, Little Red Riding Hood. These workshops are for children in Reception to Year 6.

## **Christmas Jumper Bank**



Reflection

As we end our first week back, we invite you to join in a reflection on RESILIENCE.

For some of us, the break will have been a welcome rest, it will have restored our energy to show RESILIENCE in the New Year, but this will have not been the case for everyone. We ask you to remember those in our community and worldwide who must display RESILIENCE on a daily basis to accomplish basic tasks.

For example, many of us will have taken for granted being able to read a sign or a set of instructions over the holiday, but for those who are blind or partially sighted even tasks like this can present real challenges to daily life and these do not stop during a Christmas break from school.



Last week, January 4th marked World Braille Day, this has been celebrated since 2019 and is a day to raise awareness of the importance of Braille as a means of communication for blind and partially sighted people.

Braille is a tactile representation of alphabet and number symbols using six dots to represent each letter and number, and even musical, mathematical and scientific symbols. Braille, named after its 19th century French inventor, Louis Braille, is used by blind and partially sighted people to read the same books and texts as those printed in a visual font.

As we reflect on the coming year, we invite our community to remember not only the RESILIENCE we must show personally but also the RESILIENCE others must display. The challenges others face are sometimes hidden from us but when we stop and consider their needs it enables us to show compassion, care and make the world a better place for everyone.
